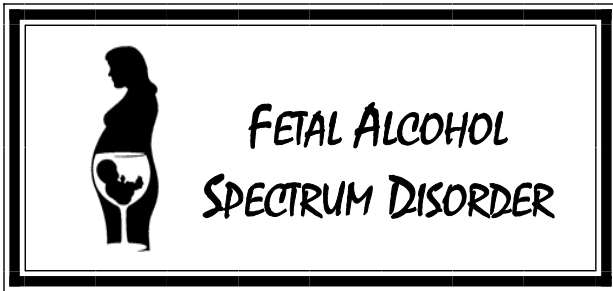

OVERVIEW

The goals of the course are:

1. To gain an in-depth understanding of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD)
2. To help prevent FASD with substance abusing women of childbearing age.

4. Identify four specific concerns that parents of alcohol affected individuals have around the patterns of behavior or cognitive abnormalities that are inconsistent with the developmental levels across the life span.
