





For nearly fifty years, Centennial AHEC has been working "behind the scenes" to build and support the healthcare workforce and provide community health education where gaps exist. 

We held two AHEC of a Party events this past year - one in Burlington and one in Greeley.

The events provide exposure to our program all in one place to bring awareness to our work and partnerships.



Our Regional Health Connector Shauna Richardson was successful in getting the Colorado Melanoma Foundation's Sun Bus out to Burlington in June. The mission of The Sun Bus is to reduce the burden of skin diseases, including cancer, through effective screening, education, and research programs.

Colorado experiences a high rate of skin cancer, including melanoma, which is likely linked to the state's high elevation and active outdoor culture.

An estimated 2,000 new cases of melanoma are projected each year in Colorado, according to the University of Colorado School of Medicine.




